minds of American people. While it is true that Revere was not the only rider that night, that does not refute the fact that Revere was riding and successfully completed the first phase of his mission to warn Hancock and Adams. Longfellow's poem has been criticized by modern historians for overstating the role of Revere in the night's events. Revere's may have been a better story, as Dawes and Prescott were more successful in achieving their missions. In 1896 Helen F. Moore, dismayed that William Dawes had been forgotten, penned a parody of Longfellow's poem. Other riders such as Israel Bissell and Sybil Ludington are often suggested as having completed much more impressive rides than Revere's, however, the circumstances behind the others' rides were entirely different. Bissell was a news-carrier riding from Boston to Philadelphia with news of the battle at Lexington. Ludington's ride came two years later in the New York-Connecticut area.

Dr. Joseph Warren was killed during the battle of Bunker Hill on June 17, 1775. As the many soldiers that died that day were buried in mass graves, Revere was able to identify Warren because he had placed a false tooth in his mouth and recognized the wire he used for fastening it.

William Dawes died in Marlborough, Massachusetts, on February 25, 1799. He is believed to have been buried in the King's Chapel Burying Ground, though his remains may have been moved to his wife's family plot in Forest Hills Cemetery in Jamaica Plain.

Paul Revere died on May 10, 1818, at the age of 83, at his home on Charter Street, in Boston. He is buried in the Old Granary Burying Ground on Tremont Street.

**PLATTER PERSPECTIVE**

Ella Fitzgerald had a warm winning manner of communicating the great popular songs of more than 50 years ago, particularly those of Rodgers and Hart, Cole Porter and, of course, George Gershwin. Ten of the 12 selections here are by the composer and include "But Not For Me," "Maybe," "How Long Has This Been Going On," and my personal favorite, "Someone To Watch Over Me." I grew to love the last song through a recording by the late Barbara Ruark, who was married to John Williams of Star Wars fame.

Ella's album of just the Gershwin tunes was available earlier as a ten-inch LP and was heavily used as a training manual in conservatory seminars on how to sing Gershwin. The secret of her vocal gifts is, I think, in the unfussy and straight forward approach she takes to each selection, letting the sentiment, poetry, and charm exude their spell. The song, "Looking For A Boy," is a

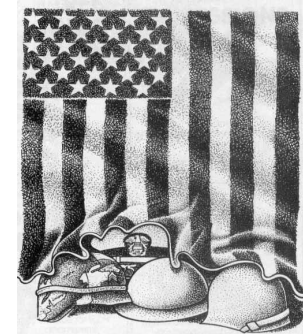

very moving experience, while most of the others are quite good. Nine of the Gershwins feature accompaniments by Ellis Larkins, a phenomenal pianist whose softest chords, notes and arpeggios have more different shades of meaning than many more well-known titans of the keyboard can muster. The tenth, "Oh Lady Be Good" is marred by a raucous orchestral arrangement of Bob Haggart and his group and too much silly scat singing by Ella. The remaining selections—Duke Ellington's "I'm Just A Lucky So And So" and Jimmy McHugh's "I Didn't Mean A Word I Said" spotlight the solid instrumentals of Billy Kyle and his trio.

My research through a helper with advanced computer skills, has concluded, unfortunately, that it is not presently available as a CD reissue. Indeed, it may be one of the rarer LPs as my copy is the only one I have seen.
