A letter to Windsor citizens
To the editor:

At the Town meeting on June 12, resident Clarence Smith made a motion to increase the road construction article from \$150,000 to \$250,000. The ensuing discussion centered around the need for more road work to be done because the consensus is that our roads are in serious need of repair. The town is responsible for about 31 miles of town roads. Mr. Smith argued that although the selectmen had proposed an increase of \$50,000 from last year it was not enough to make a significant difference.

The voters present agreed and voted to add \$100,000 to the article—making the total \$250,000. After review of the final approved budget with our assessor we learned that this amount put the town above the tax levy limit by approximately \$50,000. This requires the town to call a Special Town meeting for July 24 at 10 a.m. at the Windsor School to allow for a vote on two articles:

1) To see if the town will vote
